The president welcomes everyone and introduces the service

LITURGY OF PENITENCE

The president pronounces God's blessing, in these or similar words:

St Paul says

'Be imitators of God; love as Christ loved; do not grieve the Holy Spirit; put away all anger and bitterness, all slander and malice.'
So let us confess our sins to God, who forgives us in Christ.

In a dark and disfigured world we have not held out the light of life: Lord, have mercy.

All Lord, have mercy.

In a hungry and despairing world we have failed to share our bread: Christ, have mercy.

All Christ, have mercy.

In a cold and loveless world we have kept the love of God to ourselves: Lord, have mercy.

All Lord, have mercy.

May the God of love and power forgive you and free you from your sins, heal and strengthen you by his Spirit, and raise you to new life in Christ our Lord.

All Praise to you, O Christ.

THE ADDRESS

THE PRAYERS OF INTERCESSION

Each intercession ends with

Lord, hear us

All Lord graciously hear us.

At the end

Merciful Father,

All accept these prayers for the sake of your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

THE LITURGY OF THE SACRAMENT THE PEACE

The President introduces the peace in these or other suitable words

God has called us to live in peace.

cf 1 Corinthians 7.17

The peace of the Lord be always with you.

All and also with you.

PRAYER AT THE PREPARATION OF THE TABLE

Be present, be present, Lord Jesus Christ, our risen high priest; make yourself known in the breaking of bread.

All Blessed be God for ever.

THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

The Lord be with you and also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

All

All We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All It is right to give thanks and praise.

Father, you made the world and love your creation. You gave your Son Jesus Christ to be our Saviour. His dying and rising have set us free from sin and death. And so we gladly thank you, with saints and angels praising you, and saying:

All Holy, holy, holy Lord,
God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.
Hosanna in the highest.

We praise and bless you, loving Father, through Jesus Christ, our Lord; and as we obey his command, send your Holy Spirit, that broken bread and wine outpoured may be for us the body and blood of your dear Son.

On the night before he died he had supper with his friends and, taking bread, he praised you.

He broke the bread, gave it to them and said:

Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

When supper was ended he took the cup of wine.

Again he praised you, gave it to them and said:

Drink this, all of you;
this is my blood of the new covenant,
which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.

Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

Father, we remember all that Jesus did, in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross.

Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation, we proclaim his death and resurrection until he comes in glory.

Great is the mystery of faith:

All Christ has died:
Christ is risen:
Christ will come again.

Lord of all life,
help us to work together for that day
when your kingdom comes
and justice and mercy will be seen in all the earth.
Look with favour on your people,
gather us in your loving arms
and bring us with the Blessed Virgin Mary, St Michael, and
all the saints to feast at your table in heaven.

Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, O loving Father, for ever and ever.

Eat and drink in remembrance that he died for you, and feed on him in your hearts by faith with thanksgiving.

The president gives instructions about how communion is to be received.

The president pronounces God's blessing, in these or similar words:

The peace of God, which passes all understanding, keep your hearts and minds in the knowledge and love of God, and of his Son Jesus Christ our Lord; And the blessing of God almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, be among you and remain with you always.

The president dismisses the congregation in these or similar words:

Go in the peace of Christ.
