



From the Vicar: Reflections around the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM)

One of the ways I reflect on how God is acting and working among us and through us at Great St Mary's with Michaelhouse, is to ponder with gratitude who God sends to be part of our congregation and wider community. It is each one of us that God has called together to be part of Great St Mary's. God is working through all of us – although we may not think of ourselves in this way – for the sake of our church community and the wider world.

Part of our collective participation exercising the mission and ministry to which God has called us together is expressed in our governance and at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM). We are grateful to everyone who has joined the electoral roll, which is a way of expressing support for the ministry of Great St Mary's and a requirement for those who wish to stand as a member of the PCC. At the Annual Meeting (made up of the Vestry meeting for the election of churchwardens, and the APCM to receive reports and elect PCC members) we elect the church wardens for the year ahead and PCC members, who normally serve for three years. This year, we have five vacancies for a PCC with twelve elected members. At the APCM we consider the formal Annual Report of the parish, including our financial statements and the report on the electoral roll revision, and the less formal Annual Review which outlines the activities of the previous calendar year. We also look ahead as we receive the budget. The APCM provides the opportunity to say thank you to the church's elected officers including the church wardens and assistant wardens, PCC treasurer and secretary, deanery synod representatives, committee chairs and members, as well as the countless volunteers who enable us to be a flourishing church in the centre of Cambridge.

As we look forward, I want to encourage each one of us to reflect on the gifts we have and believe God might call us to be using, for the good of the church and the wider world. It is my experience that God sends us the people with the gifts to do those things that God is calling us to do. Therefore, one of the things we are looking forward to in the coming weeks is to run a 'skills, time and talents' process, where we will invite each one of you to reflect on what you might feel called to contribute. Many of you are already giving very generously of your time and talents. This is about enabling us to reflect on whether what we are currently giving is what God is calling us to give, and for people who are new to our church community, to be able to explore how they believe God is calling them to contribute to God's mission.

I hope that many of you will be able to look at the Annual Report and Annual Review on the website, or at the paper copies available in church, and that many of you will join us on Sunday for the APCM at 11.30am in Michaelhouse.



(a) a report on the numbers entered on the new Electoral Roll;

(b) an Annual Report on the proceedings of the Parochial Church Council and the activities of the parish generally;

(c) the financial statements of the Council for the year ending 31st December 2024;

(d) the annual report under section 50 of the Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction and Care of Churches Measure 2018;

(e) a report of the proceedings of the Deanery Synod; and

(f) other matters of parochial or general Church interest.

In this Notice, 'parish' means an ecclesiastical parish.

The Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM) is an important day in the life of Great St Mary's. The first part is called 'the Vestry Meeting', at which our Churchwardens are elected. Those eligible to vote are those on the Great St Mary's Electoral Roll and anyone who lives within our parish.

The second part is the Annual Parochial Church Meeting, which will be the opportunity to receive the Financial Report for the accounts for 2024 and the Budget for 2025, and to **elect five members to the Parochial Church Council (PCC)**. The Annual Review of activities in 2024 will also be available and we will discuss plans for 2025.

The calling notices have been published in the South Porch and in Michaelhouse. Nomination papers for Churchwardens and PCC members will be available at coffee from Sunday 4 May or by emailing the PCC Secretary, Marion Cobby, at pccsec@gsm.cam.ac.uk.

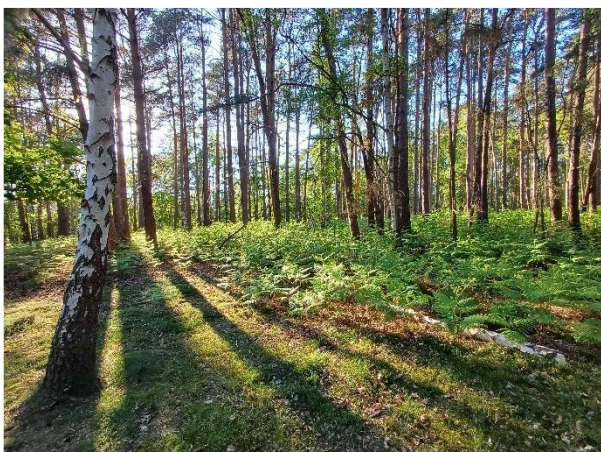
Any person being nominated for the post of PCC member must already be on the Electoral Roll (a copy of which is displayed in Great St Mary's and at Michaelhouse).

Notes

1. Every lay person whose name is entered on the Church Electoral Roll of the parish (and no other person) is entitled to vote at the election of parochial representatives of the laity.
2. A person is qualified to be elected a parochial representative of the laity if –
 - (a) his or her name is entered on the Church Electoral Roll of the parish and, unless he or is under 18, has been entered there for at least the preceding six months;
 - (b) he or she is an actual communicant (which means that he has received Communion according to the use of the Church of England or of a Church in communion with the Church of England at least three times during the twelve months preceding the date of the election);
 - (c) he or she is at least 16; and
 - (d) he or she is not disqualified as referred to in paragraph 3 of these Notes.
3. (1) A person is disqualified from being nominated, chosen or elected or from serving as a churchwarden or a member of a parochial church council, a district church council or a joint council if the person is disqualified from being a trustee of a charity (and the disqualification is not subject to a waiver which permits membership of a parochial church council, district church council or joint council).
- (2) A person is disqualified from being nominated, chosen or elected or from serving as a member of a parochial church council, a district church council, a joint council or a deanery synod if the person is included in a barred list (within the meaning of the Safeguarding Vulnerable Groups Act 2006).
- (3) A person is disqualified from being nominated, chosen or elected or from serving as a member of a parochial church council, a district church council, a joint council or a deanery synod if the person has been convicted of an offence mentioned in Schedule 1 to the Children and Young Persons Act 1933 (with that expression being construed in accordance with Rule 71(2) of the Church Representation Rules).
- (4) A person's disqualification under sub-paragraph (3) may be waived by the bishop of the diocese by giving the person notice in writing.
- (5) A person is disqualified from being nominated, chosen or elected or from serving as a member of a parochial church council if the person has been disqualified from holding office under section 10(6) of the Incumbent (Vacation of Benefices) Measure 1977.

Our satellite unit there sustained only minor damage and our team of seven have been fixing, cleaning and preparing the space to receive patients once again.
