Don't worry about children making noise, and do know that families are very welcome to take part in our Children's Church at Michaelhouse during the first half of the service – just ask a Welcomer for directions.

About standing, sitting, and kneeling: our practice of standing (for singing and prayers of praise), sitting (for listening attentively), and kneeling (for times of repentance and reverence) are ways we help involve our bodies in our prayer. All these postures of prayer are optional — no one will mind if you don't take part, and if you cannot physically stand or kneel, you can stand or kneel in your heart.

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The Gathering

ORGAN PRELUDE

As we gather, you are invited to take a quiet moment to pray and to be present to God. You may like to use this Prayer of Preparation.

Almighty God, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hidden: cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy name; through Christ our Lord. Amen.

OPENING HYMN

Please STAND, as you are able, to join in singing the opening hymn during which the choir and ministers enter.

THE GREETING

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

All Amen.

The Lord be with you.

All And also with you.

The President welcomes everyone and introduces the service.

PRAYERS OF PENITENCE

Please SIT or KNEEL.

The Deacon says these or similar words:

Let us confess our sins in penitence and faith, firmly resolved to keep God's commandments and to live in love and peace with all.

A short time of silence is kept.

All Almighty God,
our heavenly Father,
we have sinned against you and against our neighbour

in thought and word and deed,
through negligence, through weakness,
through our own deliberate fault.
We are truly sorry and repent of all our sins.
For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, who died for us,
forgive us all that is past
and grant that we may serve you in newness of life
to the glory of your name.
Amen.

The President pronounces God's absolution of our sins using these or similar words:


May the God of love and power forgive you and free you from your sins, heal and strengthen you by his Spirit, and raise you to new life in Christ our Lord.

All Amen.


The Liturgy of the Word

THE SERMON

As the Gospel procession returns, the organist improvises on the theme of the reading. Please remain standing until after the preacher offers an opening prayer.

A brief time of quiet reflection follows the sermon.

Please STAND

All We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

> We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made.

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit,
the Lord, the giver of life,
who proceeds from the Father and the Son,
who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified,
who has spoken through the prophets.
We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.
We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.
We look for the resurrection of the dead,
and the life of the world to come. Amen.

We **KNEEL** or **SIT** for the prayers, led by a member of the congregation. These responses may be used:

Lord, hear us:

All Lord, graciously hear us.

The prayers may end with:

All Merciful Father, accept these prayers for the sake of your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

The Liturgy of the Sacrament

THE PEACE

Please STAND.

The President may introduce the Peace with a suitable sentence, such as:

We are the body of Christ. In the one Spirit we were all baptised into one body. Let us then pursue all that makes for peace and builds up our common life.

The peace of the Lord be always with you.

All And also with you.

We share with one another a sign of Christ's peace.

Please REMAIN STANDING to sing

THE OFFERTORY HYMN

The offerings of bread and wine are brought forward and placed on the table. Thank you for all donations supporting the ministry of our church. In place of an offertory collection we invite you to donate at the end of the service online or via a card reader.

THE PRAYER OF PREPARATION

All Yours, Lord, is the greatness, the power, the glory, the splendour and the majesty; for everything in heaven and on earth is yours.

All things come from you, and of your own do we give you.

Please STAND, as you are able.




Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.


The President gives thanks for the mighty acts of God.

THE LORD'S PRAYER

Let us pray with confidence as our Saviour has taught us.

All Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread.

And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us.

And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.

All Though we are many, we are one body, because we all share in one bread.

INVITATION TO COMMUNION


The President gives directions about how to receive communion and says these words of invitation.

Draw near with faith. Receive the body of our Lord Jesus Christ which he gave for you, and his blood which he shed for you. Eat and drink in remembrance that he died for you, and feed on him in your hearts by faith with thanksgiving.

The ministers at the altar receive communion and prepare to share the sacrament with the congregation, as we sing the


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
