Dear friends

In the last edition of eMag, I wrote about the ebb and flow of activity and rest—how many things at Great St Mary's pause for a while in the summer, creating space to reflect, reset, and notice what we might otherwise miss. Since then, I've been thinking about making bread, because it's something I can only do when I give myself time to do it – it can't be rushed. There's something about that rhythm of active and passive, of working the dough with strength and focus, and then stepping back to let it rest. But of course, the resting stage isn't really passive at all. On the surface, nothing seems to be happening. But deep within the dough, the yeast is busy transforming it—stretching, lightening, preparing it for what it's meant to become.

There's something spiritual about this. It reminds me that our times of rest and stillness—those moments when we feel like we're doing "nothing"—can be some of the most fruitful. Sometimes it's only when we stop wrestling with a problem that the answer gently appears. Sometimes it's only in pausing that we hear the quiet voice of God. And sometimes, though we may not see any change at all, something essential is quietly rising within us. It takes trust to rest. Trust that the world will keep turning without us. Trust that God is at work even when we are not. Trust that growth does not always look like effort. Trust that transformation takes time.

If your summer includes time for rest, I hope it may be more than simply a break—I hope it may be like dough resting on the windowsill, quietly being changed and becoming what it's created to be. And if this season doesn't allow for rest—if responsibilities keep you kneading and working—then I hope you may still find small moments of stillness in the midst of it, like brief pauses between stretches of effort.

May God bless us all, in our doing and our being, in our working and our waiting.



Eco Tip - Big Butterfly Count

Have you noticed how many butterflies there are around this summer? Why not take part in the Big Butterfly Count, a nationawide citizen science survey to see how well they are doing. You just do a 15-min count at one location. You can do as many as you like up until Thursday 10 August.

Counting butterflies can be described as taking the pulse of nature and it depends on citizen scientists to help us assess how much help nature needs. The data from this and other counts will also help to identify important trends in species that will assist in planning how to protect butterflies from extinction, as well as understanding the effect of climate change on wildlife. 
Elsewhere
